

Professor Marion Thain teaches literature and the liberal arts at New York University. Her research is primarily in the areas of: aestheticism, Decadence, and early modernism; British poetry and poetics; and digital aesthetics and representations. She has published many essays and journal articles, and five books including: *The Lyric Poem: Formations and Transformations* (Cambridge University Press, 2013); *Michael Field' (1880-1914): Poetry, Aestheticism, and the Fin de Siècle* (Cambridge University Press, 2007); and *Poetry of the 1890s* (Penguin, 1998). She is a director of *The Victorian Lives and Letters Consortium* (http://tundra.csd.sc.edu/vllc/), leading the creation of the Michael Field Diaries Online.
